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11. DOCUMENTATION AND SCRUTINEERING:

Self Scrutineering will apply. Compliant forms will be available with the online entry form and must be submitted online. A Scrutineering sticker will be included in the race envelope and must be displayed on the motorcycle. Competitors are warned that should the motorcycle fail a sample spot check any official during any time of the day, then action will be taken against that competitor (Refer to GCR 93 (iii) and SSR 226 2017 MSA National Motocross Standing Supplementary Regulations) – the Stewards to decide appropriate penalty.

12. RIDERS BRIEFING:

All riders must be present at the briefing at the stipulated time and venue. Representatives may accompany the rider to the briefing, but may not represent the rider. Failure to attend the riders briefing may result in a fine of R100.00.

13. PRE RACE PADDOCK / WAITING ZONE:

The Pre-race paddock / Waiting Zone is situated	<i>Directly behind the start gates</i>
Before the scheduled start time of the first heat, competitors competing in the race concerned should move to the	



pre-race paddock / Waiting Zone.

14. STARTS:

The Start of the race will be in accordance with SSR 230 – SSR 234 in the 2017 MSA National Motocross Standing Supplementary Regulations

Competitors who do not take part in official practice must confirm their intention to start to the COC, no less than one hour before the start of the first heat.

If a rider is not present in the pre-race paddock when he/she is called to the start line, he/she will forfeit his/her starting position.

A change of vehicle will be permitted subject to valid reasons for the change being given and the Stewards of the meeting agreeing to the change. (Refer to GCR 259)

15. END OF THE RACE:

The waving of the chequered flag will signify the end of each race. (Refer to SSR 237 – SSR 240 in the 2017 MSA National Motocross Standing Supplementary Regulations)

The MSA Steward/COC reserves the right to impound and examine any motorcycle at their discretion
Riders need to Exit the track as soon as they receive the chequered flag

16. RESULTS:

Notwithstanding the general protest period laid down in the GCR's, the protest period for motocross will be 15 minutes from actual posting of the FINAL results on the notice board. (Refer to GCR 200, GCR 275 & SSR 255 in the 2017 MSA National Motocross Standing Supplementary Regulations)

These results are not to be removed and disciplinary action will be taken against any person removing these results without authority. Additional copies may be obtained from the Secretary of the meeting.

17. PRIZEGIVING:

The prize giving will take place as soon as possible following the last heat and after the results become final.

Dead heats will be resolved as per GCR 275 and SSR 239 in the 2017 MSA National Motocross Standing Supplementary Regulations

Competitor's attention is drawn to GCR's 274, GCR 280, GCR 281 and point 13 in the NR 01/17 Motocross Regulations

Any rider not attending prize giving will forfeit his/her prize unless suitable arrangements are made with the Race Secretary or Sponsors Representative

The Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the meeting or any part thereof. In the event of any of the above, the Competitor/Entrant has no right to claim against the Promoter/Organiser in respect of any loss or damage he/she may incur, other than that specified in GCR 244. The meeting will not be postponed, abandoned or cancelled without the consent of the MSA Stewards in accordance with GCR 152.

Force Majeure – only 30% the race entry will be refunded, the race will not be re scheduled
